The 311App was designed to increase the amount of community agency when it comes to systematic neglect that happens in our neighborhoods. You can use the app to report pollution, littering, transportation concerns, public health issues and more.


In this How-To, we're going to show you how to report pollution using the Former Crawford Coal Plant Site at 3501 S. Pulaski Road and the recent implosion of a concrete stack on the morning of April 11th, 2020.

Step 1: Download the Chi311 App on the App Store or Google Play *NOTE, creating an account is optional and not necessary to file a report. If you do decide to make an account, you will need a first name, email, and password.*






Step 2: Click the "create" button on the bottom of the screen. Click "Next"




Step 3: Click the request that states "Parks, Trees, and Environment". Click "Next"




Step 4: Under "Pollution" select "Air, Pollution, Odor, or Dust Complaint". Click "Next"



Step 5: Under "New Service Request" click "Create Request". Click "Next"




Use this service request type to report dust, odors or other air pollution from commercial and industrial sites. This service request does not apply to privately owned barbecues and fireplaces.




Step 6: Type in the address of where you want to report air pollution (in the above example we use the former Coal Plant Site Address, you can use your home intersections, etc). Click "Next"




Step 7: Select the location type for your complaint (Coal Plant would be Industrial). Click "Next"



Step 8: Select where in that area the pollution is occurring (for this example, it would be everywhere in the LV neighborhood so we selected "other"). Click "Next




Step 9: If reporting a business, type their name in (in this case, "Former Crawford Coal Plant Site"). Click "Next"




Step 10: Add contact information of business. *NOTE that this page is optional Example: Hilco



Step 11: Select the type of pollution that you are reporting (in this case, "Smoke"). Click "Next"



Step 12: Select the cause of the pollution (again, in this case "Demolition")




Step 13: Type in the the information for the Alderman in the Ward in which you are reporting pollution *NOTE—this page is optional* but strongly encouraged:)





Step 14: Type in your first name and phone number. *NOTE that this information is required. Other details (email, address, etc.) are optional. The city might contact you to

follow up and ask additional questions and or to give more information on their investigation process.



Step 15: Review Information. *Optional to add photos—3 maximum (we used one of the photos from our previous post—credits to Alejandro Reyes)

Step 16: Click "Send Request" you should receive a confirmation with a report number *NOTE again that creating an account is not required for this app but is helpful if you want to have more access to follow up on a request
